Australia Day 2017

The Australian High Commission in Kuala Lumpur commemorated Australia Day on 24 January with a stylish reception celebrating Australia's renowned active lifestyle and the strength and depth of the Australia-Malaysia bilateral relationship, which will enter its 62nd year in 2017.

The event, which was held at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre, was attended by over 1,000 distinguished guests. The Honourable Datuk Seri Mah Siew Keong, Minister of Plantation Industries and Commodities, represented the Malaysian Government, as the guest of honour.

In his welcoming remarks, the Australian High Commissioner to Malaysia, H.E. Rod Smith reflected on enduring partnership between Australia and Malaysia, each nation's shared commitment to working together for the security and prosperity of the Asia-Pacific region and above all, the enduring bond between the Australian and Malaysian people.

"Australia Day is an opportunity to reflect on the personal friendships and connections that are at the heart of our relations. Friendships forged through education, through business, tourism, migration, the arts, political and youth exchanges, as well as through decades of defence and security cooperation," the High Commissioner said.

The High Commissioner also reflected on the evening's theme and the ability of sport to break down barriers and bring people together, citing the many examples of sporting collaboration between Australia and Malaysia, across sports including football, netball, hockey and cycling.

Guests at the reception then had the opportunity to sample some of the outstanding Australian produce available in Malaysia, including succulent seafood, high-grade meats, organic nuts and quality wines, provided by our Australia Day partners Southern Rock Seafood, Meat & Livestock Australia and Nature's Farms.
