Eleven Malaysian researchers, academics and students are headed to Australia next year as winners of the prestigious Australia Awards Endeavour Scholarships and Fellowships, funded by the Australian Government.

Recipients will travel to Australia to undertake research and postgraduate study across a broad range of disciplines at leading universities and research institutes.
